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

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A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

On behalf of The Sudbury Savoyards, I am honored to welcome you to our 2025 production of Gilbert and Sullivan's *Ruddigore*. Gilbert and Sullivan's tenth collaboration, *Ruddigore* premiered in 1887, on the heels of *The Mikado*. Gilbert's storyline was probably pulled from several places, including his previous one act opera, *Ages Ago* and his own Bab Ballads, as well as Heinrich Marschner's 1828 opera, *Der Vampyr*, and the real Murgatroyd family of Yorkshire! Gilbert played with the elements of melodrama here, but in his typical fashion, flipped everything on its head. Is the hero a villain? The villain, our hero? Are the ancestors even dead? Who is really "Mad"?

The Sudbury Savoyards was founded in 1961, and our mission is to produce the works of W. S. Gilbert and Arthur Sullivan "on a grand scale," with a large chorus, a full orchestra, costumes, lighting, sound and top-notch performers. Since then, we have produced all thirteen extant G&S comic operas, as well as many summer plays, concerts, and outreach events. We like to say we "put the 'community' in community theater," as we are one of the only groups remaining committed, not only to producing the works of Gilbert and Sullivan, but to a chorus and crew which is open to all who wish to participate, where inclusion and support of all people is at the core of our values.

We also remain committed to the relief of world hunger, having donated over \$250,000 towards that cause prior to our incorporation as an independent 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in 2016. Since then, we have continued to honor that legacy by raising funds for local hunger relief, most recently in conjunction with the Wayside Inn, by presenting *A Christmas Carol* at the Inn's Martha-Mary Chapel in December. We were able to donate \$2,131 to A Place to Turn in Natick this year. We continue to look for ways to fight hunger, include everyone, and produce high quality shows year after year.

CELEBRATING SIXTY-FOUR YEARS OF THE SUDBURY SAVOYARDS



In 1961, as a means of raising money for the new church buildings under construction, a group of Sudbury Methodists decided to put on a production of *Trial by Jury*. Staged in the Parish Hall and costumed with choir robes, this was the beginning of a group that was soon to be christened The Sudbury Savoyards.

Throughout the 1960's the stage in the Sudbury Town Hall provided the setting for the annual Gilbert & Sullivan production. In 1969 expansion onto the stage of the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School was necessary for the second staging of *The Mikado*. This production, with larger sets, more participants on stage and a larger orchestra, began the tradition of presenting "Gilbert & Sullivan on a Grand Scale". As a result, over \$250,000 in proceeds have been donated to the relief of world hunger.

In 2016 The Sudbury Savoyards became an independent 501(c) (3) community theater organization and continues to donate proceeds to worthy causes.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Welcome to *Ruddigore*!

When approaching this production, I was struck by the unique interplay of genres and styles in Gilbert & Sullivan's playful take on melodrama. With its larger-than-life story tropes, stock characters, and supernatural elements, to me, it feels like a fairy tale—complete with curses, heroes, and villains. Fairy tales, by their nature, evoke vivid imagery, and that brought me to one of our key sources of inspiration: illustration.

In *Ruddigore*, the characters are archetypes—so clearly defined that you could almost draw them, their silhouettes alone telling you who they are. Zany twists, sudden shifts, and comedic rhythms stretch *Ruddigore*'s performers in ways that lead them to nearly appear as if they are animations. I've tried to bring some of that playful use of the full body to the sometimes more stationary world of opera.

As a 90s baby, the combination of fairy tales, music, and animation really means one thing... a certain animation studio with a mouse mascot. I couldn't help but draw inspiration from their illustrated musical retellings of fairy tales like "The Little Mermaid" and "Beauty and the Beast". You might notice echoes of both of those films in our production, along with some cinematic approaches to the visual flow and construction of the show.

Ruddigore is very much a story about stories. We tell stories to process the things that happen to and around us. To question the construct of stories highlights the questions we have about ourselves. Through its characters, *Ruddigore* asks timeless queries about the ways we define ourselves, process the world, and carry the weight of our histories.

- What defines us? Is it our family, our history, the people we love, or the experiences we've lived?
- What drives us? Are we motivated by our hearts, societal rules, or the expectations placed upon us?
- How much control do we truly have over our own lives? Are we bound by the sins and decisions of our ancestors, or can we forge our own path?

Gilbert & Sullivan shows are like fairy tales or films in that their stories are retold and reviewed over and over again. They are made new by their audience and the environment in which they are viewed. When it comes to theater, we also add into that equation the people on, behind, and below (in the case of the pit) the stage. So, while it has been performed before, and will be performed again, the production of *Ruddigore* you are about to see is singular and will never exist this very way ever again.

That's pretty magical. Or is it scary? Probably both. Both is good.

PLOT SYNOPSIS

Ruddigore, or “The Witch’s Curse” was the 10th collaboration between Gilbert and Sullivan. The operetta is a parody of the stock melodrama — the villain who carries off the maiden; the priggishly good-mannered poor-but-virtuous-heroine; the hero in disguise, and his faithful old retainer who dreams of their former glory days; the snake in the grass who claims to be following his heart; the wild, mad girl; the swagger of fire-eating patriotism; ghosts coming to life to enforce a curse; and so forth. But as one critic noted, Gilbert turns the moral absolutes of melodrama upside down: Good becomes bad, bad becomes good, and heroes take the easy way out. The Baronets of Ruddigore are cursed. Anyone who succeeds to the title has to commit a crime every day — or perish in inconceivable agony.

Robin Oakapple, a young farmer, loves Rose Maybud, but both are too shy to tell the other. But Robin has a secret. He is really Sir Ruthven Murgatroyd, the rightful Baronet of Ruddigore, in disguise. His younger brother, Despard, believing Ruthven to be dead, has assumed the title. Robin’s foster brother, Richard, seeking Rose for himself, tells Despard of Robin’s deception, and Robin is forced to accept his true position, losing Rose to Richard in the process. Now the Baronet of Ruddigore, Robin is confronted by the ghosts of his ancestors who step from their picture frames in the gallery of Ruddigore Castle to confront him for failing to conscientiously commit his daily crime. Robin eventually finds a way of satisfying his ancestors demands whilst continuing to live a blameless life.

Tony Parkes

November 10, 1949 – May 6, 2024



Tony fell in love with Gilbert & Sullivan at the age of eight, when he saw the Bil Baird Marionettes do *HMS Pinafore* on television. He dreamed of being a G&S performer and memorized all the patter songs, but instead chose to pursue a career as a square and contra dance caller, traveling internationally, making recordings, and developing his singing and patterning skills.

A fan of The Sudbury Savoyards, Tony joined the group in 1997 which began his progression into ensemble and leading roles, backstage and technical work, serving on the Board of Trustees, choreographing, participating in summer shows and July 4th Sudbury parade floats, and Stage Directing.



Tony appeared with us in all 13 extant Gilbert & Sullivan operettas, some two and three times, plus at least 4 Summer Shows, and made his Stage Director debut with *The Sorcerer* in 2016.

Tony was a true G&S aficionado, knowing every word to every operetta, and was always ready to help define words, explain references, or play the piano. Just last year he was bestowed with the honor of 'Yeoman of Regard' in recognition of his love for The Sudbury Savoyards by sharing his expertise, generosity, guidance, and extraordinary efforts for over 27 years.

Lucy Dean

March 1, 1943 – May 28, 2024



A beloved member for several decades, Lucy joined the chorus of bridesmaids and the costume construction crew for our 1990 production of "Ruddygore" and participated onstage through the 1997 production of *The Yeomen of the Guard*.

Lucy was involved with costume construction and /or Costume Design for the following 30 years, retiring in 2020 after *H.M.S. Pinafore*. She was also a member of the New England Unit of the Herb Society of America, serving as the Chair from 1996-1998, and was a long-time member of the Memorial Congregational Church in Sudbury, where she taught Sunday School.

Lucy was especially talented in hat-making, assembling costume kits to be made at home, covering backstage wardrobe duties, pitching in as house staff for summer shows, and enjoyed marching in the July 4th Sudbury Savoyard parade floats. She always rose to the challenge whenever needed and was depended on greatly.

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



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
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
